Here's How Your Donation Will Help

\$25 - will help feed one dog at our kennel for one month. We house over 50 dogs at our facility. This does not include the many dogs and cats that are in foster homes also waiting for their special day. We feed them too.



\$50 - will help offset the costs for basic medical and veterinary services that we provide to every new dog and cat that comes under our care. Upon their initial arrival, we give them a

general wellness assessment and evaluate their immediate situation to bring them up to our minimum adoptable standards. When needed, this can include basic Rabies vaccination, Distemper, Micro-chipping, Heartworm test, Flea/Tick preventative, and a general wellness examination by our trained staff. Additional treatments for any conditions discovered are also performed. **\$100** - will pay for a spay or neuter procedure. Overpopulation is a major issue here in the United States. Too many dogs and cats and not enough good homes for all of them is a major reason that all the rescue shelters are full. We require all of our

dogs and cats, puppies and kittens too, to be spayed or neutered. We want to insure that none of our pets contribute to this overpopulation problem. One of our mottos is to "Keep going with our mission until all the cages are empty".



\$250 - will help offset the cost of special medications and ongoing medical treatments that some of our dogs and cats need. This includes Heartworm treatment

which is not just the monthly preventative pill, but the actual treatment for a dog that has unfortunately been infected. If left untreated, this will be fatal to the dog. We have seen a recent increase in Heartworm positive dogs. Treatment is required; it's expensive, and critical for the dog's survival. Other medical conditions such as cancer also require expensive medications and treatments. **\$500-\$1,000** - will help offset costs for special surgeries and treatments when needed. This includes such procedures as removal of tumors, treatments of major organ failures, and in extreme cases where amputation of a leg is the only recourse to save an animal's life.
